Currently there are over 125,000 retirees who are eligible for KPR membership. Join us if you're retired or eligible for retirement under any of these systems:

Kentucky Employees Retirement Systems (KERS)

County Employees Retirement Systems (CERS)

State Police Retirement Systems (SPRS)

KERS includes state government employees, circuit clerks, non-teaching staff at the regional state-supported universities (Eastern, Western, etc.), property valuation administrators, employees of local health departments, regional mental health agencies, quasi-state agencies, and others.

CERS includes city and county governments, police and firefighters, non-teaching staff of local boards of education (including bus drivers, janitors, cafeteria workers, etc.), local library employees and other local government agency employees.

SPRS includes all uniformed state police officers.

Who we are:

Kentucky Public Retirees (KPR) is a nonprofit (501(c)(5)) organization established in 1983 to support and protect the benefits of current and future government retirees.

KPR has elected state officers and a board of directors who serve on a voluntary basis. There are 15 chapters located through the state which meet monthly, provide information to members, host guest speakers and events, and contribute to the community through volunteer activities.

What we do:

Help protect and improve retirement benefits;

Provide a lobbyist to appear before the General Assembly on behalf of retirees;

Represent and promote the interest of retirees with Kentucky Public Pensions Authority and other state agencies;

Represent retirees at legislative committee meetings and other special committees and commissions appointed by the Governor;

Provide advice and consultation to public officials in matters such as health insurance and retiree needs;

Provide an outlet for fellowship, comradery and community service for retirees;

Work with other employee and retiree organizations on the local, state and federal levels.
